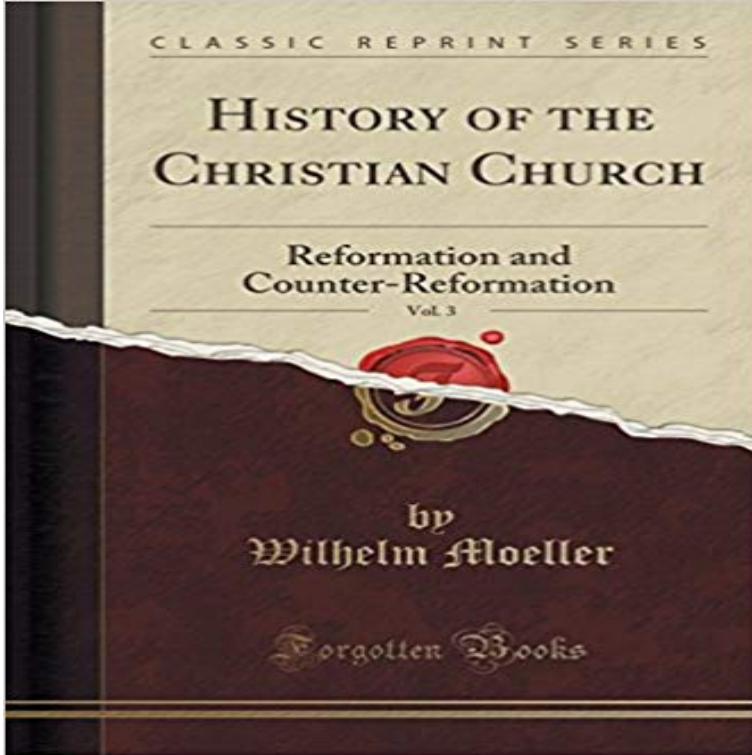

Moller, the publisher entrusted the completion of the unfinished work to the authors colleague, Dr. G. Kawerau. Owing to the fact that the greater part of Dr. Mollers work, as he left it, treated of subjects that would naturally have been included in a later volume (the Greco-Russian Church, English Methodism), Dr. Kawerau may be regarded as being mainly responsible for the present instalment. Divisions I. and VII. were written by him independently, as well as several chapters in other divisions. The references to books bearing upon the subject (which could have been greatly increased) have been purposely limited. The present Volume carries the history only down to the year 1648, as being the terminus recommended by the course of German Ecclesiastical History. The Editors standpoint is thus described in his own words: A History of the Reformation is essentially influenced by its authors position. I gladly acknowledge myself a disciple of Luther. But for that very reason I have always kept before my eyes his exhortation to every historian, intrepidly to write what is true and I have endeavoured not to forget this duty. The cause of truth can be served only if we keep inviolate the prima lex historiae, ne quid falsi dicere audeat, deinde ne quid veri non audeat, ne qua suspicio gratiae sit in scribendo, ne qua simultatis (Cicero, De Oratore, II., 15).
