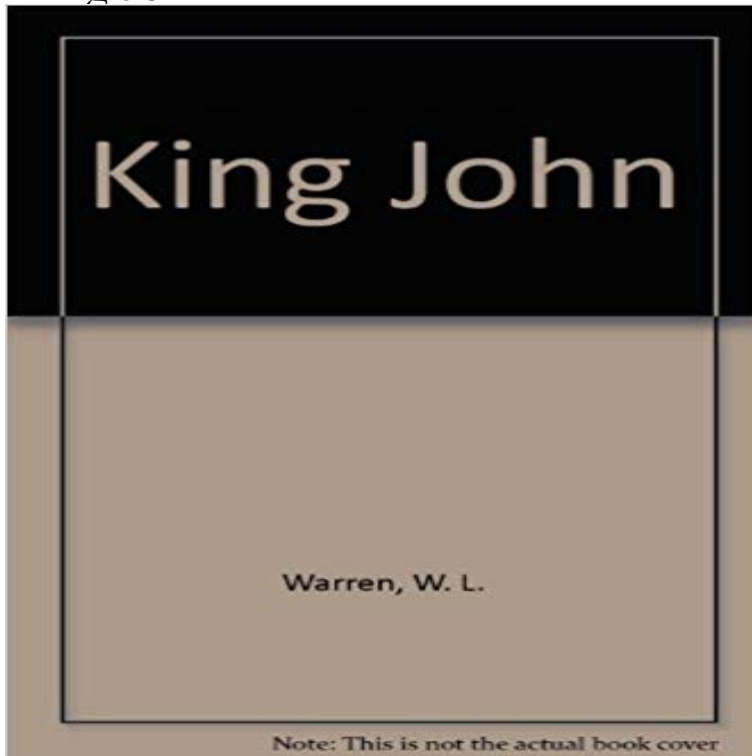


King John
