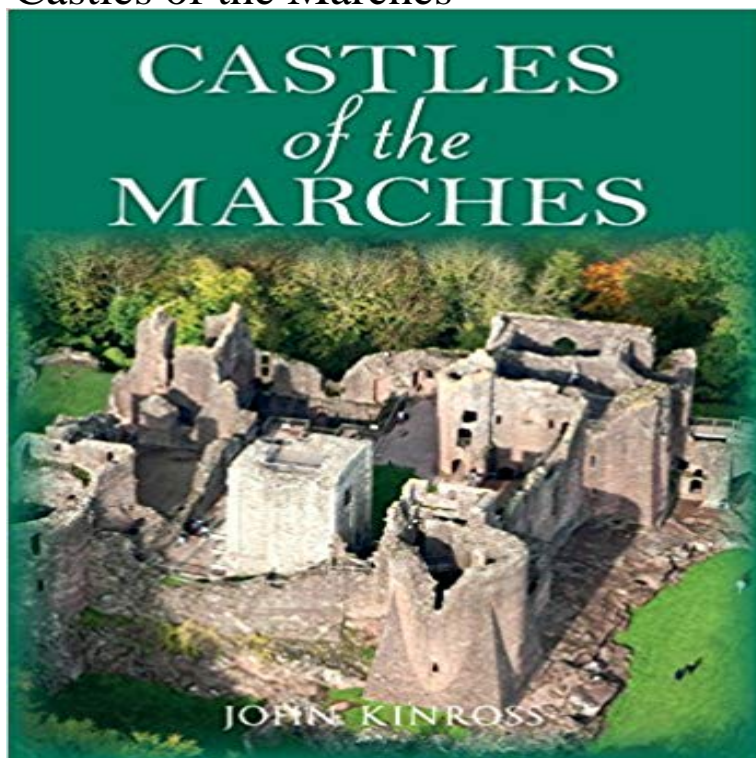


Castles of the Marches
